2. Summary: Key Roles and Major Achievements

Associate Dean for Research, Anne Spencer Daves College of Education, Health, and Human Sciences (2022-present)

As Associate Dean for Research, I lead the research enterprise for the Anne Spencer Daves College of Education, Health, and Human Sciences, the second-largest college at Florida State University. The College features six distinct academic units, nine support units, three shared governance units, and one constituent support group spread across 10 academic buildings. I oversee a significant research enterprise that includes more than 150 active research faculty and staff, 36 scientific laboratories, three K-12 laboratory schools, and over \$84 million in annual research expenditures.

My responsibilities bridge research administration, policy development, and strategic leadership across multiple scales. At the college level, I manage and support over 100 funded projects annually, coordinate research-related capital projects, and supervise staff who provide comprehensive grant support to faculty. I ensure fiscal responsibility for the Office of Research budget and implement effective proposal tracking systems to maintain our robust research infrastructure. The College's Office of Research is the largest college-level research office at FSU, with six pre-/post-award grant managers, an HR representative, an accountant, a methodologist, a lab manager, a clinical research coordinator, two senior editors, a research amplification coordinator, and several dual-appointed State of Florida Department of Education personnel.

Under my leadership (c. 2022 to present), the College and its affiliated centers and institutes have increased annual research expenditures totals from \$17 million in 2020 to over \$75 million in 2025, increased its annual external grant proposal submission count by over 400%, and launched five major research development, research administration, and research amplification programs (Academy of Scholars, Research Transition Incentive Program, Open Access Publication Program,

an expanded Dean's Circle Catalyst Grant Program, and an expanded College Research Showcase event).

My role extends beyond campus through a multi-tiered approach to advancing education and health initiatives. At the local level, my team and I work with our Dean/Superintendent to provide administrative and financial oversight to FSU's three research lab schools (Leon County, Pembroke Pines, and Bay County). At the state level, I lead assessment initiatives and teacher development programs for the Florida Department of Education and work directly with government officials to shape health and education policies. Nationally, through my involvement with the LEARN coalition, I twice yearly brief members of Congress and their senior staff on Capitol Hill, providing research-based insights on education and health policy matters.

I lead our College's engagement with FSU's transformative health initiative: FSU Health. Working in close partnership with the Colleges of Medicine, Nursing, and Arts & Sciences, I formulate MOUs and execute agreements that are part of FSU Health's vision to build a comprehensive healthcare ecosystem in North Florida. Our College's expertise in health sciences, particularly in areas such as exercise physiology, nutrition, and human performance, complements the medical and nursing expertise of our partner colleges. Through these collaborative efforts, we are helping to establish FSU as a leader in both healthcare education and research while addressing the critical human development and healthcare needs of North Florida's communities.

This comprehensive engagement - from local implementation to federal policy - allows me to maintain strategic relationships with key stakeholders and funding agencies while ensuring our research findings effectively inform both policy and practice at all levels of government.

Fellow, National Academy of Kinesiology (2022)

I was inducted as an Active Fellow (#620) of the National Academy of Kinesiology (NAK) in 2022, becoming one of only nine professors in my subdiscipline to have achieved this distinction. In my citation, the Academy noted that my published research focusing on cultural politics and political economics and ecologies of sport, exercise, and physical activity has proven 'groundbreaking' and 'pivotal' in addressing social inequalities emerging from the participatory and consumption-based aspects of human movement.

I have coordinated Florida State University's efforts to increase the standing and support of its doctoral program in kinesiology. As a result, in 2023 the program rose from No. 29 to No. 3 in the nation in the 2023 National Academy of Kinesiology (NAK) rankings. Anne's College made strategic investments that facilitated high-impact human movement science research. These investments allowed the college to assemble a team of scholars who secured significant research funding and published findings in academic journals. The increased profile of the program has also led to more students applying to and studying in kinesiology programs at FSU. In 2023, FSU ranked No. 1 nationally in financial support for doctoral students and in the number of graduates securing tenure-track faculty positions or other jobs requiring a doctorate.

University Leadership Roles (2016-Present)

In recent years, I have served in several important university leadership roles, including Chair of the Council for Associate Deans for Research (CADR). President Richard McCullough appointed me to serve on four major President's Task Forces, focusing on internationalization, graduate program rankings, faculty recognition and external awards, and developing the University's Research Strategic Plan. These roles demonstrate my commitment to advancing research, faculty development, and the overall mission of the university.

From 2016 to 2020, I authored a major international university partnership between Florida State University and Shanghai University of Sport (A-Level in China). This partnership featured student and faculty exchange programs, a 3+1+1 matriculation agreement, and several strategic collaborations for industry and scientific research. Based on these efforts, I was recognized as a distinguished international scholar by SUS and the Shanghai Municipal government.

Currently, I am leading a significant collaboration between Florida State University and the government of Panama, working directly with their national sport governing body, Pandeportes. This partnership focuses on student exchange opportunities and research-based consultancy, with the aim of expanding sport and physical activity provision throughout Panama. The initiative represents an important step in FSU's commitment to international engagement and the advancement of global health and physical activity.

Director, Center for Sport, Health, and Equitable Development (2012-2021)

From 2012 to 2021, I served as the Founding Director of the Center for Sport, Health, and Equitable Development (SHED) at Florida State University. Under my leadership, SHED became one of the nation's leading centers for sport-based research, outreach, and community development, aiming to use sport to inform and create change in underserved local communities. The Mayor of Tallahassee has recognized the Center as a 'game changer' for transforming how sport and physical activity programs are provided to underserved and underrepresented communities throughout the city and region.

During my tenure, SHED-affiliated students and faculty provided over 30,000 service hours to 20 community partners, and more than 3,000 Florida State University students worked in and with communities, providing sport and physical activity to more than 10,000 clients and community members from around the region. SHED-affiliated students and faculty also published over 300 peer-reviewed journal articles, presented more than 400 papers at major conferences, published more than 20 books, received more than 20 federal, state, or foundation grants totaling \$2 million, and authored more than a dozen technical and advisory reports for government and industry agencies.

President, North American Society for the Sociology of Sport (2016-2018)

I have played a significant leadership role in the North American Society for the Sociology of Sport (NASSS), the major international organization with which my scholarship is most closely aligned. My involvement culminated in a three-cycle presidential term (President-Elect, President, Past-President) from 2016 to 2018. During my time in these presidential roles, the society held three of its most highly attended annual conferences, and total membership grew by nearly 20%. As President of NASSS, I was at the forefront of implementing new membership recruitment initiatives, streamlining organizational communication, encouraging public sociology activities, and launching new programs to acknowledge research fellows and promote social inclusion.

Most notably, the conference we organized in Windsor, Canada, marked a pivotal shift in the organization's focus toward increasing access to the society and the field. We brought together prominent academics with local tribal and indigenous leaders to explore meaningful ways that North American sport sociologists could better support reconciliation practices, both in the host city and beyond. This initiative helped establish new pathways for collaboration between scholars and indigenous communities while reimagining the role of sport sociology in supporting indigenous self-determination and cultural preservation.

High-Impact Research (2005-Present)

My research has consistently made a significant impact in my field, as evidenced by my publication record, which includes over 250 peer-reviewed research publications. I have

published over 100 refereed journal articles and book chapters, two refereed first-authored research-based books, three edited books, 12 refereed review articles, five non-refereed technical reports, and 150 published conference abstracts or proceedings. My books have garnered critical acclaim and recognition, with *Sport, Spectacle, and NASCAR Nation: Consumption and the Cultural Politics of Neoliberalism* (2011) being awarded the North American Society for the Sociology of Sport "Outstanding Book of the Year" for 2012 and selected as a CHOICE Reviews' "Outstanding Academic Title" for 2013. My edited book *Sport, Physical Culture, and the Moving Body* (2020) also received the CHOICE Reviews' "Outstanding Academic Title" award in 2020, making me one of only five scholars in my field to have twice earned this distinction. My research has been cited extensively, with a current Google Scholar i10-index of 62.

I have been actively involved in securing grants and funding to support my research, community outreach, and programming initiatives. I have served as the Principal Investigator (PI), Program Director, or Co-PI on more than a dozen resource, program, and research grants totaling over \$14 million in support of community-based sport, physical activity, and education programs, interventions, and infrastructural projects. Some notable examples include:

- Education Leadership Development and Workforce Training - over \$6 million supporting statewide initiatives in teacher development, career technical education, and workforce innovation
- Community Infrastructure and Recreation - approximately \$1.5 million for public space development, including Cascades Park amenities and community physical activity resources
- Health and Cultural Programming - approximately \$30,000 supporting research and interventions focused on culturally relevant health promotion and sustainable healthy habits
- Sport and Physical Activity Research - roughly \$35,000 funding studies of community access to physical activity and youth sport participation patterns
- International Research and Development - about \$75,000 supporting cross-cultural sport studies and international scholarly exchange
- Research Infrastructure and Capacity Building - approximately \$25,000 supporting laboratory development, research travel, and faculty development initiatives

In my current role, I serve as the PI on two major funded projects: a) a state-funded grant from the Florida Association of District School Superintendents aimed at supporting education leaders across the state in carrying out their responsibility as the educational leader of their community to ensure every student has access to a high-quality public education; and b) a Federally-funded grant to support researching the efficacy of tertiary CTE programs.

Pedagogy and Student Mentoring (2005-Present)

Throughout my career, I have been dedicated to teaching and mentoring students. I have taught a wide range of courses at the undergraduate and graduate levels, developed new courses, and served on numerous doctoral and master's thesis committees. My commitment to student success is evident in my role as the Director of the Department of Sport Management Graduate (Ph.D.) Program from 2013 to 2018 and again from 2020 to 2021. The FSU doctoral program was consistently ranked as one of the top programs in the United States by various ranking services during my tenure (including #1 in the nation by College Choice for five consecutive years).

I have chaired (or currently chair) 21 doctoral dissertation committees. I have served as a member of 25 additional doctoral dissertation committees and as a university representative on 15 more. At the master's level, I have chaired 11 thesis committees and served as a member of 14 others. Additionally, I have chaired 136 master's non-thesis committees and served as a member on 138 more. This extensive involvement in graduate student supervision and mentoring demonstrates my strong commitment to fostering the next generation of scholars in my field. To wit, my former

doctoral students have achieved numerous successes in their careers, securing positions in research, administration, and tenure-track roles at prestigious institutions across the United States. My mentees have gone on to contribute to the advancement of their respective fields at universities such as the University of Kansas, Miami University (Ohio), the United States Air Force Academy, the University of Florida, the University of South Carolina, the University of Massachusetts, Boston, and Pacific University (among others).
